# Application for a New Premises Licence

### **DECISION**

To grant the license as applied for.

#### **REASONS**

The sub-committee has considered an application for a premises licence for Nisa Local, Unit 63 Savoy Place, 281, Farnborough Road, Farnborough. The application seeks authorisation to sell alcohol for consumption off the premises 7 days a week, from 7am to 11pm Monday to Saturday, and from 7am to 10pm on Sunday.

In making its decision, the Sub-Committee has had regard to the provisions of the Licensing Act 2003, the Secretary of State's Guidance issued under section 182 of that Act, and the Rushmoor Borough Council Statement of Licensing Policy.

Each member of the Sub-Committee read and considered the application and accompanying documents and listened carefully to the representations made today.

The Sub-Committee must consider the likely effect of the granting of the application upon the promotion of the four Licensing Objectives: the prevention of crime and disorder: public safety; the prevention of public nuisance; and the protection of children from harm. The decision must be evidence-based.

No representations have been received from any responsible authority; significantly, the police and the Council environmental health department.

The application attracted two representations from other parties. These representations raised a number of concerns that are relevant to planning law, but the development within which the premises sit has been granted planning permission. The sub-committee has been advised that matters such as parking, signage, traffic, pedestrian access and noise from deliveries are not relevant to this application. We confine ourselves to considering what promotes the licensing objectives.

In the view of the Sub-Committee, there is no evidence that the grant of the licence as applied for will add to problems of crime and disorder and nuisance. The decision of the Sub-Committee is therefore to grant the application subject to such conditions as are consistent with the operating schedule.
