Grants to Voluntary Organisations

Summary and Recommendations:

This paper provides an update on the Community and Ward Community grants awarded by the Cabinet Member for Concessions and Community Support and recommends approval for two awards totalling £3,500 to Pinewood Family Group Preschool and The Vine Centre.

1. Introduction

• This paper provides an update on grants of £1,000 or less, awarded by the Cabinet Member for Concessions and Community Support and seeks approval to award £2,000 to Pinewood Family Group Preschool and £1,500 The Vine Centre.

3. Financial Implications

• The remaining budget for voluntary organisations for 2016/17 is £11,630. Taking into account the four Community grants that have been awarded by the Cabinet Member for £1,000 or less, the ten Ward Community grants and the awards recommended for Pinewood Family Group Pre-school and The Vine Centre, will leave £1,930 available for allocation in the remainder of this financial year.

Aims of Organisation/General Comments	Mission is "To support and improve the quality of life empowering vulnerable and homeless adults (primarily over the age of 21) to transform their lives and fulfil their potential within NE Hampshire and the Blackwater Valley and to provide appropriate open access Community Services." The project will support rough sleepers during the cold winter nights using the Severe weather emergency protocol model of opening once temperatures dip below 0 degrees from December 2016 until March 2017. Guests accessing this project engage with staff and volunteers many for the first time and are encouraged to attend and take part in The Vine Centre Journey Programme comprising 27 services to support them into safe accommodation and ultimately independent living. The project has been run successfully since 2013 and was awarded "Excellent Practice" Accreditation from Housing Justice in March 2015 This funding is for 4 nights Emergency Winter Night Shelter. Each night costs £592 for up to 10 people.
